

Meeting the Challenges of the 2019-20 School Year

The 2019-20 school year was uniquely challenging as we dealt with the COVID-19 pandemic and transitioned to distance learning. Prior to the school closures, we were providing our standard weekly 1:1 tutoring and mentoring sessions (September 2019 -March 2020) and also ran both our T++ Coders (November-December 2019) and I Build (January-February 2020) enrichment programs.

Starting March 16, Tutoring Plus conducted wellness check-in calls with all families and then launched remote 1:1 tutoring sessions between students and volunteers. We also started weekly virtual group sessions during April, and both the 1:1 and group sessions continued through mid-June. During this time, we also provided families with information around food security, financial assistance, COVID-19 testing and other community resources. We recognize that learning and growth can only take place when basic needs are being met, so we also arranged deliveries of food and household supplies to families on an as-needed basis.

Internally, we are assessing our virtual programming to identify assets that we should continue to build on as well as areas that we can improve in. Through this assessment, we seek to ensure that our fall 2021 programming, if virtual, will continue to provide a high quality learning opportunity for our students.




Our Students: Demographics
